History	Founded in 1795 as the first planned campus in the United States, Union College is a highly selective, private, liberal arts college with engineering that is consistently ranked among the nation's top colleges. Set on 100 acres in downtown Schenectady, N.Y., including eight acres of formal gardens and woodland known as Jackson's Garden, Union is within easy reach of New York City, Boston and Montreal, rural areas and major East Coast ski slopes.
International vision	Rather than "small" meaning "parochial," Union is committed to diversity and to cultivating a sense of global connectedness. As an institution whose core mission is preparing students for the 21st century, Union integrates international experiences into the life of the College both inside and outside the classroom. Members of the Union community strive to bring Union to the world and the world to Union. Union will also increase student and faculty diversity, which is associated with increased student satisfaction, cognitive development and academic success. Diversity will also help the College achieve many of its important objectives in admissions: increase applicants and attractiveness to high achievers, improve retention rates, and create a more intellectually engaged student population with a heightened sense of social responsibility and global awareness. Programme	A Union education is a four-year integrated living and learning experience. Union offers the following undergraduate degrees: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Science degrees in Bioengineering, Computer Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. In cooperation with Union Graduate College, Union also offers five-year, two-degree programs leading to a bachelor's degree and a master's degree in selected fields. The College has an eight-year, three-degree program in cooperation with Albany Medical College and Union Graduate College and a six-year, two-degree program in cooperation with Albany Law School.
