#### Housing Options for Tuition/Fees/Room/Board Exchange Students

Please read this document all the way to the bottom.

Now that you have been accepted, you should also begin considering your housing options for your semester at K-State. There are two housing/meal plan options that are covered by the tuition/fees/room/board exchange at K-State.

## 1. Traditional Room in the Residence Halls and Any 14 Meal Plan

If you select this option, you will be able to choose a traditional double room in one of the residence halls listed below. The meal plan that is covered by the exchange with this housing option is the *Any* 14 Meal Plan.

#### 2. Hybrid Apartments and Jardine 150 Meal Plan

If you select this option, you will be able to choose to live in one of the two <u>Hybrid Apartment</u> options listed below. The meal plan that is covered by the exchange with this housing option is the *Jardine 100* + the *Jardine 50* meal plan. When you are applying for housing, you should select the *Jardine 100* meal plan. You will be able to add the *Jardine 50* meal plan later on in the semester.

- 1 room inside 3-bedroom apartment with 1 shared bathroom
- 1 room inside 4-bedroom apartment with 2 shared bathrooms

#### **How to Apply for the Residence Halls**

**Step 1:** Complete the application for a housing contract. The \$30 application fee is waived for T/R/R/B exchange students. If you are asked to pay this fee, please contact seboro@ksu.edu before continuing your application. A verified K-State eID and password is required to complete this process. You will then receive an email from Housing and Dining at Kansas State University with information about completing the Housing Contract.

**Step 2:** Complete the housing contract. With the contract you will respond to some questions and read through the terms and conditions for the contract. It is important you fully understand the contract.

**Step 3:** After completing your contract, you will have the opportunity to select the residence hall and room you will live in. The order in which students can select their room is based on when the contract is completed.

## **How to Apply for the Hybrid Apartments**

**Step 1:** Complete the application for a Jardine Apartment and select the Hybrid option(s). The \$30 application fee is waived for T/F/R/B exchange students. If you are asked to pay this fee, please contact seboro@ksu.edu before continuing your application. A verified K-State eID and password is required to complete this process.

**Step 2:** If a Hybrid apartment is available, you will receive an email prompt to complete the Jardine Agreement. With the agreement you will respond to some questions and read through the terms and conditions for the agreement. It is important you fully understand the agreement.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Housing available during university break periods (Thanksgiving, winter, and spring breaks). We recommend that exchange students select a housing option that is open during the break periods.

\*\*Space in the Hybrid Apartments is extremely limited. For this reason, we recommend students to complete the residence hall process but also complete a Jardine Hybrid application. If a spot opens in Hybrid, students would be able to cancel their residence hall assignment and switch over.
