### 4. Host University

**1. Describe the teaching system. When does the semester start? What are the requirements for courses? How long is the examination period?**

6<sup>th</sup> of September we had orientation. Another 2 weeks after orientation we had time to choose the subjects, visit all the courses we want and after that choosing preferred ones. Every professor has a different style of teaching, but during the semester we participate definitely more intensive than in the CTU. On the other side there were no examination period as we have on CTU. For one subject we had 3 quizzes and one greater work on the working area during the whole semester and we presented the results every few week (IMC). For other subject we were doing reports every week and in the end of semester had a presentation (ICSA). For CBMS we did two presentation, and for Law - one big work 40 pages long. For OB we did 2 presentations one work and a mid-term exam. Every time we worked in the group of 4-5 people. All the professors had really good level of English, all of them were studying at American universities before.

**2. Which types of housing was available? What would you recommend?**

I get graduate dorm 3, which was the best option. All exchange student applied for dormitory get this one. Another possibility was accommodation which were more expensive and out of the campus.

**3. Would you recommend any leisure/sport activities?**

We usually went to gym or outdoor swimming pool, which is free for students of NCTU. There was also one inside swimming pool with sauna. Lots of student also preferred to run inside campus.

**4. What is the best type of transport in the city?**

Once I used bus to supermarket, which is for free for the students of university. Also we used Uber and taxi. Because there is not many interesting place for us in the city, we didn't travel inside city too much.

A-mart or Costco for bigger shopping, which is about 20 minutes far from campus by bus. The food is possible to be bought from 7eleven and FamilyMart at the campus or in any Dinning hall.
